
FIX FORWARD LESSON PLAN

Name: Upper Level Supply Cart List

Grade(s): 4-8



Structure / Activity:

After a repair discussion in the classroom have students brainstorm a list of tools and supplies to stock the Fix-It Cart. This can be done separately on scraps of paper or sticky notes, or altogether on a large piece of paper or a white board.


The list below was compiled by the students in the Repair Club at Woodland Hill Montessori School. After each meeting the group would add their ideas for tools and supplies based on the day's repairs.

Shop in person for the tools to get a sense of the size and feel of each item. Try to purchase the highest quality tools you can afford as they will last the longest. The list here is meant to be used as a starting point. It is ever evolving!

Have the students unbox the items, organize and create labels for the drawers, and label each tool. This will create a sense of ownership and responsibilty for the cart and its contents.

Plan to make additional purchases over time as more repairs are made and different tools are required.

Designate a point person to restock consumable materials and take on the long term care of the cart. As a school, meet to deterine where to store the cart and how to share and use the cart.






Upper Level Cart Side 1

















This model has pedal speed control & up/down needle key control.
